The rules are made known to the community throughout the school year.


The board of the school will review the rules of order annually.

## Measures in case of violation of the rules

- The students are given the opportunity to explain themselves in a face to face meeting.
- Talk with the teacher, Head of School, Principal or other employees. The incident is documented.
- It can be reported to the home through conference hours, written messages, or telephone calls.
- Suspension from lessons and trips/events organized by the school:
  - Students who seriously or repeatedly break the rules may be excluded from the lesson/s.
  - In grades 1-7, students can be absent from individual lessons or for the rest of the day, and in grades 8-10, students can be suspended for up to three days.
  - The Principal decides on expulsion after consulting with the student's teacher. The parents of students in Grades 1-7 must be notified before expulsion is implemented for the rest of the day. Before a decision on expulsion or loss of rights, consideration must be given to using other measures.
  - Expulsion from teaching/school is a single decision according to Section 2 of the Public Administration Act. Parents/guardians/students can appeal the decision to the Statforvaltern.

In special cases, the student may be required to be transferred to the public school in the home municipality. Other measures must have been implemented before this is implemented. Cf. The Independent School Act § 3-3. The home municipality makes a decision. The decision can be appealed to the ministry.
